In order to celebrate the 400th anniversary of Jean de La Fontaine's birth and French President Emmanuel Macron's pledge to make reading a "great national cause", the AIPLF organises a competition for TY students of French. There are prizes for the winners!

- Participants in a group of 2, 3 or 4 students will represent their class. They must **read out loud a fable of their choice by Jean de La Fontaine** in French (individual entries will not be accepted). Entries will be judged on the quality of the performance and **pronunciation** of participants.
- This competition is only open to TY students who study French as a Foreign Language in the R.O.I.
- Entries must be submitted by a French teacher as a **video recording** (please note that teachers must retain proof of written consent from the participants' legal guardians).
- The video recording must be sent by a French teacher via [wetransfer.com](https://www.wetransfer.com) to aipf.ie@gmail.com
- Entries must be made specifically for this competition.
- The use of copyrighted material is not permitted.
- Maximum video length accepted: 4 minutes.
- The name of the file must indicate the names of the French teacher, school and county.
- Deadline: **12th November 2021**
